Lemon and Spoon Race

Resources:

Lemons, Spoons, Scarves, Felt-tips

Make sure each child has their own lemon, spoon, felt-tip and scarf.

Allow children to write down some of the responsibilities that they have, on the surface of their lemons. E.g. completing their school work and tidying their room.

Inform children that their lemon is their responsibility to look after.

They will be competing in a series of lemon and spoon races, and whoever completes each race without dropping their lemon, is the winner.

Find a safe space to hold the races.

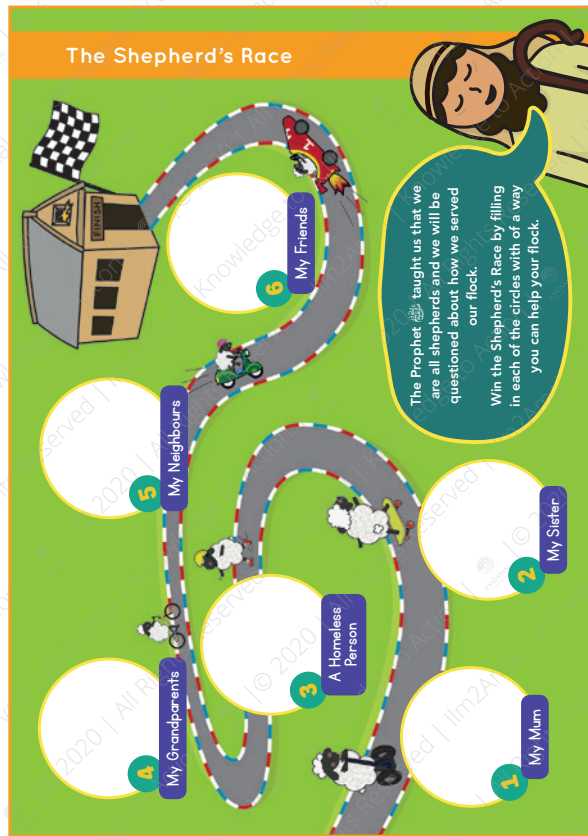
- **Race 1:** Carry your lemon in your spoon from the starting line to the finishing line.
- **Race 2:** Carry your lemon in your spoon from the starting line to the finishing line using the scarves as blindfolds.
- **Race 3:** Choose a partner and carry your lemons in your spoons with your legs tied together using the scarves.

Conclude this activity with a discussion around the following question:

Question: What does this activity teach us about being responsible.

Emphasise that we all have responsibilities in life and we are all responsible for taking care of them.

- What is a shepherd?

Potential Answer: A shepherd is someone who looks after sheep. Everyone who has someone to look after can be called a shepherd.

- What is a flock?

Potential Answer: A flock is a group of sheep. We can call the people that we have to look after our flock.

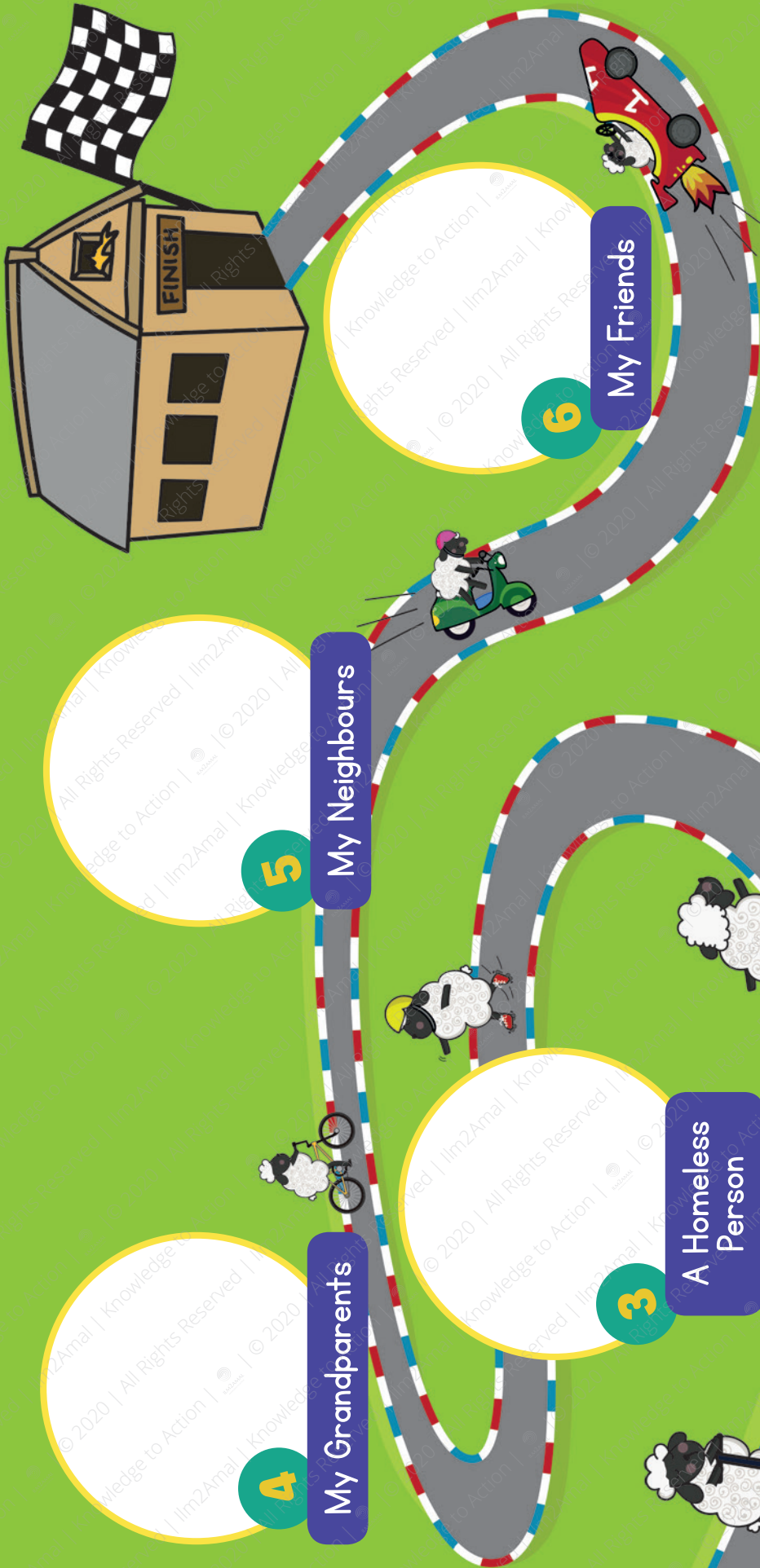
Using a stopwatch, time your children to see who can complete the shepherd's race the quickest. Their task is to write down one way they can look after the different people who make up their flock.
